

Donohoe becomes SAME Fellow

Retired U.S. Coast Guard Capt. Michael J. Donohoe was recently inducted into the Academy of Fellows of the Society of American Military Engineers in a formal ceremony in Arlington, Va. Of the more than 27,000 members of SAME, fewer than 3 percent have been inducted into the Academy of Fellows.

SAME was founded in 1920 to bring together all phases of U.S. engineering for the advancement of knowledge and the rapid mobilization of engineering capabilities in the interest of national defense. The organization is the premier professional military association in the country, uniting architecture, engineering, construction, facility management and environmental entities and individuals in the public and private sectors to prepare for and overcome natural and manmade disasters, and to improve security at home and abroad.

The Academy of Fellows was established in 1995 to recognize members of SAME who have been members in good standing for at least 10 years and have distinguished themselves in service to the nation, the engineering profession and the Society.

Donohoe served his country for 24 years as an officer in the U.S. Coast Guard and was directly involved in numerous environmental clean-up efforts including the Exxon Valdez oil spill. During more than 10 years as a member of SAME, he has chaired the SAME Regional Training and Education Conferences and provided leadership in the Memphis SAME Post. Donohoe is currently senior vice president of Tioga Environmental Consultants. Prior to working at Tioga, he served as vice president of environmental services at Pickering Engineering for 12 years.
